## **More Fire Museum Of Maryland Car Show Pictures**



<< The Fire Museum rotates its exhibits frequently. This impressive Baltimore Fire Department 1933 Mack tractor towed a 65 foot long 1898 Hale Water Tower, one of the ultimate fire-fighting devices. The tower used water pressure to achieve a vertical position and was capable of delivering vast quantities of water on a blaze. The tower was originally pulled by three horses, but was refitted multiple times and was in service into the 1960s.
