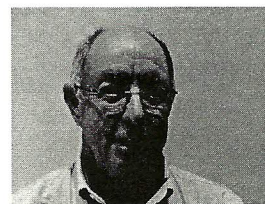


Activity Report

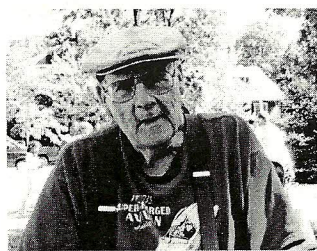
Thanks to Francis and Margaret
