

# Test Your Automotive History Knowledge



On the Club’s Spring Tour to the AACA Museum on May 20<sup>th</sup>, members were given an automotive history quiz to complete for a door prize. At the Museum, **Dave Benson** was awarded the prize for his excellent work answering some tough questions. Our guess is that **Carrie Benson** helped quite a bit. We are giving the rest of our members the chance to take this quiz just for fun! The quiz answers appear at the bottom of the page, but play fair and complete the questions before you look at the correct answers.

All questions are worth 10 points and if there are multiple segments to a question each of them is 10 points. A score of 250 or more puts you in the category of knowledgeable about automotive history. A lesser score means that you need to get to the AACA Museum and bone-up on the history of the automobile.

1. Ford’s Model T in 1923 had sales of almost 2 million vehicles, which was almost 60% of the US market. What car brand was #2 in sales that year?

In no particular order: Plymouth – 2001, Oldsmobile 2004, Studebaker – 1964 or 1966, AMC – 1987, Edsel – 1960, Packard – 1958, Nash – 1957, Hudson – 1957, Desoto – 1961, Willys – 1955, Crosley – 1952, Metropolitan – 1962, Kaiser – 1955, Corvair – 1969.

The total score possible is 390 points. Ranking: 325+ is a Senior, 275+ is a Junior, 250+ means you’re Knowledgeable; if you score under 250, you need to read more and go to the AACA Museum & Library.
